Farewell to Manna!

This is the final edition of *Manna* in its present form! Following the success of the new look Ely Ensign and the increasing number of people who have access to e-mail and the web at home, school or library, we have decided to try to use them to reach more people, more effectively and more immediately.

In future '*Manna*' will appear as a centre supplement three times a year in the Ely Ensign - starting in January 2004. Although there will be less space, many many more people will have access to it and should get to find out about the events and opportunities we are providing. More copies of Ensign will be printed and they will be sent to all our schools as well as to the parishes. If you are on our mailing list, but your parish doesn't yet subscribe to Ensign, we will continue to post a copy of the magazine to you when a '*Manna Supplement*' is included.

As well as what's printed in the Ensign there will be more detailed information, reviews and photos on the website and

clear printed directions on how to find the material.

We are also developing the use of direct e-mail communication through regular targeted bulletins. This way we can send relevant information, news and notices directly to people interested in the work we do. Already there have been three School Bulletins and that e-mailing list is growing rapidly. More Bulletins will follow aimed at people involved in ministry with adults, young people and children. You will be able to subscribe to as many as interest you. Again, for the time being, we will post bulletins to people who are unable to gain access to e-mail.

The idea behind '*Manna*' hasn't changed. It was developed as a way of telling people about events and courses and resources designed to support the work of parishes and schools. Over the years the magazine has developed: now we are planning to spread the word in different ways that will, hopefully reach more people more quickly.

Help Needed by Church Schools in Vellore Diocese

Many of you will be aware of the link between Cambridgeshire and Vellore Diocese in South India – a link we celebrated earlier this year by the extended visit of three colleagues from the Church of South India who all spent time in our schools.

This Autumn Term we are running a fund raising project to support some of the poorer Elementary Church Schools of Vellore Diocese; schools with no toilets, schools where the roof is collapsing, schools where classes work outside because there is not enough classroom space for everyone. Financial comparisons are always difficult to make, but £200 raised here in England could re-roof a school, or build a toilet block in India. The elementary schools we are seeking to assist do not receive Government support for their needs because they are church schools.

A Special Request

We would like to ask that all schools who already use Harvest and Christmas celebrations as an opportunity to raise money for deserving causes would consider making the Vellore Church Schools Project their special charity for this term.

In order to support the Vellore Schools Appeal, a pack of collective worship materials for Harvest, based on life in Vellore, will be available to all church schools, and other interested groups, at

ALSO, if you are clearing out your school or classroom libraries and have storybooks to dispose of, these would be very welcome in the Indian Secondary Schools for pupils learning English. We have the contacts, let Shirley know if you have the books! (NB please do NOT send books to Ely at this stage!)

New charge for Artefacts Boxes

The RE artefacts boxes which are loaned out to schools from the Diocesan Resources Centre are amongst our most frequently borrowed items – the boxes are full of artefacts to support work in Christianity, Buddhism, Judaism, Islam, Hinduism or Sikhism and Eco Christianity.

Unfortunately over the last couple of years the Resources Centre has experienced a lot of problems in maintaining this part of the service; boxes frequently return with items missing or damaged and a lot of time is wasted on follow-up with schools. (Over the academic year 2002- 2003, one-third of the boxes were returned to us incomplete.)

Some schools have also retained loan boxes long beyond their agreed loan period and thereby prevented others from using them. We now feel that it is right to initiate a borrowing charge for the boxes, in order to allow us to replenish our stock and to cover the losses we are sustaining on a regular basis. .

From January 2004 there will be an administration and borrowing charge levied on each box of £5 per half term.

We hope that you will continue to use this service with the same enthusiasm as previously and that you will also soon see an even greater improvement in the quality of materials on offer. Do remember to book your boxes in advance to avoid disappointment!

Children and Holy Communion

A number of parishes have recently taken the step of admitting children to Holy Communion and following the diocesan synod debate in March, PCCs have begun to put the matter for consideration on their agenda. If you would like to consider this in your church and feel that you would value some help, please ring and ask so that we can find someone to come and work with you.

There is a children's council leaflet about this and also a diocesan document outlining the procedure. Additionally there is a course in November on providing preparation for first communion using Godly Play stories.

Godly Play is a particularly appropriate teaching method for this, promoting a reflective and spiritual approach to the Bible and to liturgy yet valuing the playful imagination of the child.

Sound Bytes: 94 Songs for the 21st Century for children to share with everyone

Sound Bytes is a major new initiative for adventurous worship in the third millennium, intended for use by children aged eight and above in school, church and junior church. Many songs are also appropriate for use within Key Stage 2 of the National Curriculum and multi-faith situations.



Sound Bytes is ecumenical in spirit like *Big Blue Planet* which inspired the new collection. It draws extensively on the work of leading authors and composers of worship material for young people, with the new alongside more familiar hymns and songs.

The contents of Sound Bytes focus on realistic contemporary situations and, while exploring a range of joyful emotions, also give opportunities for children to express more reflective and sensitive feelings arising from occasions of sorrow, pain and trauma. A unique linking narrative binds together the contents within traditional and contemporary themes of season and church year, the Old and New Testaments, prayer, responsibility to God and to others, concern for the world community and care and stewardship of the planet.

Sound Bytes features an exciting spectrum of musical styles ranging from rap, blues and calypso to traditional folk song, dance and hymns. This is an extremely valuable addition to the books of songs available to resource worship with children: it is very reasonably priced and is well worth consideration.
